

ORDINANCE NO. 2016-3

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 2003-1 TO ESTABLISH THE NUMBER ISSUED BY THE CITY OF COOPERSTOWN OF LICENSES FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COOPERSTOWN, NORTH DAKOTA:

That Section 3 and Section 6 of Ordinance No. 2003-1 as amended of the City of Cooperstown City Ordinance shall be amended to read as follows:

SECTION 3: NUMBER OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSES

AUTHROIZED:

- Number of On-Sale Only Liquor Licenses not to exceed three (3).
- Number of On & Off-Sale Liquor Licenses not to exceed two (2).
- Number of On-Sale Only Beer Licenses not to exceed two (2).
- Number of On & Off-Sale Beer Licenses not to exceed four (4).
- Number of On-Sale Only Club Licenses not to exceed three (3).
- Number of Off-Sale Only Beer Licenses not to exceed one (1).


SECTION 6: EVENT PERMIT-PENALTY

An event permit may be issued to a qualified alcoholic beverage licensee or to a publicly owned or operated facility upon application to the governing body, approval thereof and payment of the fee. The event permit period may not exceed fourteen days, but may include Sundays, with the event to be specifically designated in the permit, and subject to the terms and conditions established therein. The Event Permit provides for the sale of alcoholic beverages off the regularly licensed premises of the licensee. Any person who dispenses, sells, or permits the consumption of alcoholic beverages in violation of this section or the conditions of a permit, or in violation otherwise of Section 5-02-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code as amended by the Fifty-Third Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota is guilty of

a violation of the ordinance, for which the fine shall not exceed \$500.00.
